1. NEXT STEPS: In the wake of Monday night's appalling decision by the Ferguson Township supervisors (Mascolo, Clemson, Miller and Killian), local organizers have been working with attorneys Jordan B. Yeager and Paul R. Cohen of Curtin & Heefner LLP to prepare a lawsuit to challenge the supervisors' decision and stop the development threat to our public drinking water, our agricultural security areas, and our regional planning framework.

We've been reaching out to potential plaintiffs and have begun fundraising. Thousands of dollars have already been contributed in the last few days to get things moving. Thank you to those contributors.

2. NITTANY VALLEY WATER COALITION: We've set up a new citizens' network called Nittany Valley Water Coalition – "residents of the Nittany Valley watershed working together to protect our drinking water resources from development threats."
